# QUALITY ASSURANCE MANUAL Distance and Online Learning

SECTION 02E

## Definition

Distance and Online Learning is a way of learning remotely which does not require a student's place of study to be physically located at a defined location, and usually means students engaging with learning materials and interacting with peers and tutors from home or work, via digital and/or more traditional communication means. There may be occasional face-to-face encounters with tutors and attendance at University organised events.

# **Principles**

The quality and academic standards of Distance and Online Learning programmes must be equivalent to oncampus programmes of the same level

Distance and Online Learning programmes must take into account the differences in skills, knowledge, experience, situation and culture of the intended distance learners from those studying on-campus

Schools/Departments are responsible for ensuring that staff supporting Distance and Online Learning programmes have the appropriate expertise (both technical and pedagogical), and receive appropriate training and development

In addition to the standard documentation required for a validation event (rationale, programme and module specifications), as set out in document 02 QAM *Programme Approval* the following additional information must be provided:

- A copy of the Student Programme Handbook
- A significant sample of the learning materials (identifying those responsible for production and quality assurance of these materials)
- Where all learning materials have not been developed in time for the (re)validation event, a
  detailed timetable for development of the remaining modules must be provided which includes
  information for when each module is scheduled to be delivered.

All learning materials are required to be in place before any delivery of a module commences.

The (Re)Validation panel will include a member(s) with expertise in developing and delivering Distance and Online Learning provision. The (Re)Validation panel should also be provided with access to the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) to review the sample of learning materials provided.
